Conflict Minerals & Cobalt Sourcing Policy

EBG Elektronische Bauelemente GmbH is committed to sourcing materials from companies that share our values in human rights, ethics and environmental responsibility.

EBG is concerned that the exploitation and trade of conflict minerals (as defined by the Securities and Exchange Commission "SEC") and cobalt originating in the Democratic Republic of Congo and surrounding regions is helping to finance conflict characterized by extreme levels of violence. As part of EBG commitment to corporate responsibility and to the respect of human rights in our operations and in our global supply chain, it is EBGs' goal that any use of conflict minerals, and cobalt in our products does not directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in these regions.

The specific minerals considered in the legislation are identified as Tungsten, Tantalum, Tin and Gold („3 TGs“) and Cobalt (at our certain knowledge Cobalt is not intentionally added to the products in our supply chain).
